## SUBJECT: Addendum to the Designated Substance Survey prepared for the Centre Block Major Rehabilitation Project.

To Whom It May Concern,

The Designated Substances Survey that was prepared for the Centre Block Major Rehabilitation Project concluded that fecal matter droppings were not present in the building, nor suspected of being present, in forms or quantities that would either impact future work or pose risks to human health or the environment. Contrary to these findings it is known that there are quantities of pigeon debris on the exterior masonry of the building.

Although excrement is not classified as a designated substance, care should be taken during its removal. It is recommended to use the cleaning methods identified in Appendix B: Procedures for Cleanup of Bird and Bat Droppings of the Environmental Abatement Council of Ontario's (EACO) Mould Abatement Guidelines.
