

## Eye protection for Hospital Use

Eye protection includes safety glasses, safety goggles and face shields, and must meet the following specifications:

Face shields (visors) are made of shatterproof plastic, fit over the face and are held in place by head straps or caps. These visors need to be easily disinfected to be reusable by the health care workers. If reusable, manufacturer to provide validated cleaning instructions with any reusable device. These face shields must be able to cover the entirety of the face. Face shields that do not provide fog resistance, anti-fog spray must be provided.



Goggles for splash and impact protection should be worn over normal prescription eye glasses and contact lenses. Goggles need to be easily disinfected to be reusable by the health care workers. Manufacturer to provide validated cleaning instructions with any reusable device. Goggles that do not provide fog resistance, anti-fog spray must be procured.
